
This is a time when we are intentional about expressing gratitude. It is a perfect time to pause and reflect on our many blessings.

AT THE DEDICATION SERVICES ON THE BATTLE FIELD

ourscore and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal. \* \*\* Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation or any nation so conceived and so dedicated can long endure. \* \* We are met on a great battle-field of that war. \* We have come to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. \* \* It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this. \* \* But in a larger sense we cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate, we cannot hallow this ground. \* The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember, what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. \* \* It is for us, the living, rather to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us, that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they have the last full measure of devotion: \* that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain; that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of free dom, and that the government of the people, by the people, and for the people, shall not perish from the earth

### FORMER PRESIDENT GEORGE W. BUSH HAS BECOME AN ARTIST!

Nov. 27 (UPI)--It seems the 43rd president has been busy painting, presenting a portrait he did of <u>Jay Leno</u> to the talk show host on November 20, and then announcing the inaugural debut of a commemorative Bush Center Christmas ornament featuring artwork by <u>George W. Bush</u>.

In a YouTube video message, George and <u>Laura Bush</u> briefly discuss the ornament's genesis and note that "George's original artwork" will also grace the cover of their Christmas cards this year.

The three dimensional metal <u>ornament</u> depicts a cardinal perched on a tree limb. Bush originally painted the cardinal for Ambassador Warren Tichenor. The ornament is for sale exclusively at the Bush Center Museum Store and retails for \$29.98.
