
The 2020 Census

Upcoming TFRW Biennial Convention News

At our September meeting, we elected the delegates to represent MCRWC at the TFRW Biennial Convention in Johnson City, Tennessee, on October 18-19, 2019. Those elected were Willi Frank, Teresa Tuttle, and Kyong Dawson. Marie Tillman and Brenda Graham will each be attending as a TFRW Delegate at Large.

It was also announced that the **2021 TFRW Biennial Convention** is scheduled to be held in Middle Tennessee, having been in West Tennessee in 2017 and East Tennessee this year, 2019. The last time that it was in Middle Tennessee was in 2015 when it was held in Murfreesboro, so it is due to come back to Middle Tennessee in 2021.

Marie Tillman, Willi Frank and Brenda Graham have been working on arrangements to bid at the Convention in Johnson City for the venue to be held Clarksville in 2021. It is not certain that any other Middle Tennessee clubs are going to bid, so it may be that we will come home as the elected host for the 2021 TFRW Biennial Convention.

In order to be considered, a club is required to put together a host hotel and prepare a presentation at the Convention in October. We have contracted with the **Riverview Inn** and they are vey excited at

the prospect of hosting this TFRW event in 2021. We have also contacted the City of Clarksville Division of Tourism and Special Events and they will provide us with handouts to present to the delegates at the October 2019 Convention.

Among the business that will be conducted at the Convention in October is the election of new State Officers to serve 2020 thru 2021. Marie Tillman is on the slate of officers to be elected at the Convention and Pat Allen will be installed as the new Area 5A Vice President. Those on the slate are Barbara Trautman, President; Marie Tillman, 1st Vice President; Judy Cooley, 2nd Vice President; Bonnie Siler, Treasurer; Sharon Boreing, Recording Secretary; and Sharon Ohsfeldt, Corresponding Secretary.

Other business that will be conducted includes a review of the Bylaws and Standing Rules; award presentations to clubs, and other miscellaneous business that needs to be conducted. There will be three (3) workshops, one being led by Marie Tillman on Membership and reporting forms.

Registration forms have been sent to register these ladies to represent the Montgomery County Republican Women and we look forward to hearing about that event at our November meeting.

Please make plans to attend the October meeting so that you can have a vote in the electing of your new officers.




DONATION PRESENTED

Savory Biscuit Breadsticks

- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese
- 2 teaspoons garlic salt
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 (12-ounce) tube refrigerated buttermilk biscuits
- 2 tablespoons olive oil

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a shallow bowl, mix cheese, garlic and pepper flakes. Roll each biscuit into 6-inch ropes. Brush lightly with oil; then roll in cheese mixture. Place on greased baking sheet. Bake for 8-10 minutes, until golden brown. Makes 10.
