

Celebrate Martin Luther King Day

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. is celebrated by the Republicans as a member of our **G**rand **O**ld **P**arty and, according to his niece, Dr. Alveda C. Dr. King's birthday is celebrated nationally on the third Monday of the month, this year on January 18th, although his actual birthdate was January 15, 1929. Dr. King died on April 4, 1968 in Memphis, Tennessee at the hand of an assassin.

Why the Electoral College Makes Sense

There are 3,141 counties in the United States.

- Trump won 3,084 of them.
- Clinton won 57.

There are 62 counties in New York State.

- Trump won 46 of them.
- Clinton won 16.

Clinton won the popular vote by approx. 1.5 million votes.

• In the 5 counties that encompass NYC, (Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, Richmond & Queens) Clinton received well over 2 million more votes than Trump. (Clinton only won 4 of these counties; Trump won Richmond)

 Therefore these 5 counties alone, more than accounted for Clinton winning the popular vote of the entire country.

These 5 counties comprise 319 square miles.

- The United States is comprised of 3,797,000 square miles.
- When you have a country that encompasses almost 4 million square miles of territory, it would be ludicrous to even suggest that the vote of those who inhabit a mere 319 square miles should dictate the outcome of a national election.
