### **Achievement Awards and Volunteer Hours**

The Club Achievement Awards are presented to clubs by the NFRW that demonstrate excellence in six (6) functioning areas. Points are awarded as specific guidelines are met.

Your Club President and Board will use the Club Achievement Awards as the guide to making MCRW a successful club and meeting all of the goals set by the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW).

In doing so, clubs will chalk up points for a club award, i.e. Diamond, Gold, Silver or Bronze depending upon the total points achieved over a two-year time period; July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021.

As the club works on these goals, we are demonstrating our excellence in the areas of (1) club function, (2) membership development, (3) programs, (4) leadership development, (5) campaign activities and (6) community relations.

In addition, the clubs also contribute to the goals needed by the **Tennessee Federation** to qualify for the Betty Heitman Award which is awarded to states at the NFRW Biennial Convention. The Campaign Volunteer Awards are presented to states that demonstrate excellence in donating volunteer time to the benefit of the Republican Party, Republican candidates, and/or the NFRW.

It is an effective tool to demonstrate the power of Republican Federated Women at the local, state and national levels. The program honors Clubs and State Federations that spend tremendous amounts of time volunteering (non-paid) for our Republican Party, our Republican candidates, and our Federation of Republican Women.

The <u>form attached</u> to this newsletter can be used as your guide to keeping up with your hours. In the event that a revised form is released in the Spring, we will make it available to you. You can also go to our club website and download the form.

### About Membership in //



FYI for New Members . . . as a Member of Montgomery County Republican Women, you are also part of the NFRW and the TNFRW. It is our hope that the following information will help you understand your membership.

This article was shared in the May 2019 newsletter but because we have so many new members to MCRW, we will share again.

Mission — Founded in 1938, the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) is one of the largest grassroots political organizations in the country with thousands of active members in local clubs across the nation.

Membership — A Republican woman becomes a member by joining her local club. Members of a local club also are granted membership in their state federations, ours is the **Tennessee Federation of Republican Women (TFRW)**. State federations are chartered under the auspices of the NFRW but operate under their own bylaws. Although independent, state bylaws must not conflict with the NFRW Bylaws. Clubs also operate under their own Bylaws but they must not conflict with State or NFRW Bylaws.

The Federation includes state federations with local clubs in communities across the country. Joining a local club is a great way to participate in the political process at the grassroots level, develop leadership skills and network with women in your community. Members of local clubs are automatically members of their state federation and of the National Federation of Republican Women. Dues at the local level vary (ours is \$35.00) but will include national membership dues, which are \$20.00 per member per year; \$4.00 goes to the State Federation and \$11.00 stays in our Club.

Business and elections are conducted at Conventions:
(1) Area Convention for the area of the State where the club is located; Tennessee has 18 and each one has a Vice—President. (2) The State Convention for the entire State; there is a President, 1st & 2nd Vice President, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Immediate Past President.
(3) The National Federation Convention; same officers as State are elected from all over the Nation, along with standing committees and special committees, other business.

You also have the access to both the MCRW and the NFRW websites. (continued on Page 4)

### **NFRW Profile Page**

As a member of Montgomery County Republican Women, you should go to the NFRW website and set up your profile page. Here's how to do it:

### Go to nfrw.org

- Click on "Log In" tab at top right of the page
- Locate "Need Login Help?" below that
- Click the "Activate you website.." link
- When the "Register" page comes up,
- Enter your email address; since you have been registered with NFRW and record of your email address is with them, you should be able to get activated.

You will now be able to go in and set up your page. You can even upload a photo.

All of your information about your membership will be there and you can do several "account actions" when in your "User Account" page.

Our club website is setup so that our members can join in and be part of a MEMBER FORUM. In addition, we have set up secure Member pages on that website in order to post a listing of members. This directory will be in the dropdown list under the "Members" tab. If you have not registered as a member, however, you cannot access these pages. Here is how you can register:

- Click on the "Log In" at the top right of the page.
- When you get to the "Sign Up" page, you should provide the information requested and then click "Sign Up".

- Whenever your request is received by the website ADMIN, it will be approved and you will be notified.
- After you have become a member, you will then only need to click the "Log In"

In order to connect with other members, you will click the MEMBERS tab, and then "Log in to Connect with Members".

Please go in and use the MCRW website. It has information about our club. You can get our Bylaws, keep up with the meeting speakers, special events and much more.
