


THIS IS HOW A NATURALIZED CITIZEN FEELS ABOUT VOTING

The American Red Cross of Tennessee is once again launching its annual Holiday Mail for Heroes Campaign. The initiative, led by volunteers, involves the collection of thousands of cards from across the country. These cards are then distributed to local service members, veterans and their families.

The campaign is an effort to encourage people to "Give Something That Means Something" this holiday season:

"All you need is a pen and a piece of paper to share your appreciation for the sacrifices members of the military make to protect our freedom," said Jess Hernandez, Regional Service to the Armed Forces director. "It takes just a moment to sign a card and share your appreciation. It means the world to that military member."

Churches, schools, neighborhood associations, civic clubs and any other organization are invited to participate. Cards can be purchased or homemade as long as they contain well wishes for our troops.

Once completed, holiday cards can be dropped off at any Red Cross Chapter office. Volunteers will sort through cards and make sure they're distributed to Heroes right here in Tennessee.

The Red Cross asks that cards not contain money, photos, personal information or glitter.

Cards should be delivered to the Red Cross by Dec. 1 to ensure delivery.
